**State of the Gamewardens**

2005 has been quite an active year for Gamewardens. The year really started in December 2004 for us with the trip to Charleston, SC for the dedication of USS James E. Williams (DDG 95). Administratively many of the problems of membership have been taken care of and those remaining will be covered herein. Management of the day to day events has become routine from my view. I will try to highlight the year, cover remaining administrative issues, and provide planning information for this year's National Reunion.

**The Major Events**

A large contingent of us traveled to Charleston SC for the commissioning of USS James E. Williams, DDG 95 in December 2004. There, in addition to celebrating the honor of one of our TF 116 heroes, we helped to get the SE Chapter up and running again. **Thanks, Ron and Denise Laratta** for all your hard work in arranging our hotel arrangements, SE Chapter meeting and great reception facilities. The membership assisted SE Chapter financially in getting re-established. Thanks to everyone who participated. The TF 116 Black Berets on the pier at the commissioning ceremony was a sight to behold. Gamewardens presented an obelisk and a Black Beret to DDG 95. We asked that the Beret be worn by a deserving Sea Detail BM.

Two SWCC personnel, Robert Worthington and Ed Smith, attended and met with us at the reception. Robert joined and is affiliated with the Mid Atlantic Chapter.

We increased our chapter organizations by two this year in addition to the reorganization of the SE Chapter in December. We have a NW Chapter and the Norfolk Chapter has reorganized including a new name to Mid Atlantic Chapter. This gives us five local groups to support our members in areas around the country.

We celebrated our brothers lost in Vietnam at a memorial dedication in San Diego.

We reviewed and changed the Gamewardens By-Laws to meet today's organization and communications environment in a General meeting of the membership at that dedication.

We raised funds for our active duty brothers in need during the Katrina Hurricane.

### Mid Atlantic Chapter

At the same time, April 2005, members from the Norfolk, VA area re-organized the Norfolk Chapter, got it started again, and re-named it the Mid Atlantic Chapter. Larry Weatherall, Jerry Gandy, and Clarence Cooper were elected President, Vice President and Secretary/Treasurer respectfully. This chapter also formally partitioned National to become a re-instated Formal chapter.

### VUMM Dedication

In May, a large contingent of Gamewardens and other TF 116 personnel descended on San Diego to participate in the formal dedication of the Vietnam Unit Memorial Monument (VUMM). The event was hosted by West Coast Chapter. Gene Glasco, President, W C Chapter, made all of us feel at home. **Thanks Gene!** I also want to take this time to THANK Carl Fletcher, Norman McColloch (MRFA), Everett Jones (MRFA), John Howell (SBSA), Steve Watson, and Gene for all the effort they have expended these past years, getting the VUMM ready for this dedication and its future for Gamewardens and the other units who support it.

Our hospitality room was almost in continuous use the whole dedication event. Sea stories and some truth were the order of the day. The first guy to tell a story never wins.

We hosted a wedding on the VUMM PBR at the memorial. Joe and Lorrie Vitale had an evening wedding aboard the VUMM PBR. **Congratulations Joe and Lorrie!** I know that this is a first and one of a kind get-together.

In a duly called General Meeting, we reviewed the By-Law changes that had been

recommended and made changes to make the By-Laws reflect our diverse membership and size today. Changes were made to reflect today's spending limits on the Treasurer, and, how we call for meetings by including electronic means, i.e., the Internet, our website, and e-mail to bring issues and events to the Board of Directors and the membership. No changes were made to the time each call to meeting is to be made. The By-Law Purposes were changed to include veterans from other "Brown Water" conflicts. A new Article incorporating Chapter Guidance was added. We also at this meeting approved the NW Chapter request for Informal Chapter status and the Formal Chapter status for Mid Atlantic Chapter.

At the conclusion of the General Meeting, GySgt Brian Vinciguerra, Third Platoon, Small Craft Company, Hdqt Battalion, 2<sup>nd</sup> Marine Division presented results of their deployment on the rivers in Iraq. This is the group that asked permission to use "Gamewardens" as their call sign during their Iraq operations. Brian was honored at the VUMM dedication. Their operations were similar to those of TF 116. One of this group, WO Charles Wolfe, is a member of Gamewardens.

### Stennis Government Installation

I received an e-mail from the Command Master Chief of Special Boat Team Twelve, CMC Patrick Battles in June asking about Gamewardens and wanting to stay in touch with their Special Warfare Combat Crewman (SWCC) heritage. trip and talked to the group on the evening before they started.

### **PBR Move**

During the VUMM Dedication get-together, WC Chapter and NW Chapter organized a move of the Navy Historical Center operational PBR and our static hull from San Diego to Bellingham, WA to the Bellingham International Maritime Museum (BIMM). As noted above, the BIMM was located at the home of Uniflite Boat Building. Two major reasons for this move involved the (1) that the two PBRs and their support equipment could not be adequately taken care of in San Diego because nearly all of the GWVN member support had to go into the VUMM and its maintenance. And (2), the second reason is that having the PBRs back at their build location would benefit BIMM with an operational PBR and provide the NW Chapter with a project.

The move was coordinated by Heinz Hickethier and Larry Bissonnette. USS Ogden (LPD 5) as it turned out was traveling from San Diego to Seattle, WA for Sea Fair 2005. Gamewardens was able to hitch a ride for the two PBRs; all support equipment, and some of our members. A huge effort was undertaken to get the two PBR trailers road worthy. SWCC Training and SBT 12 provided several volunteers who assisted Carl Fletcher make the trailers road worthy in San Diego. Gamewardens authorized funds to make the ship lift in San Diego and the NW Chapter got a donation of lift services in Seattle. In Seattle, the PBRs were on display on the pier for Sea Fair. NW Chapter got CBC volunteers to assist in the movement from Seattle to Bellingham. Donations of \$2,475.00 plus PBR batteries and crane services worth \$1,135.00 were raised from members to assist in the cost of the move in addition to the GWVN authorized funds. The Ships Store was

open during Sea Fair on the pier and made additional funds. We have been invited to participate in Sea Fair 2006.

In September, NW Chapter operated the working PBR during a BIMM open house. After the BIMM open house, the museum had to move into smaller quarters, greatly restricting how it could support our PBRs. It was then decided by the NW Chapter to locate the PBRs at another site. NW Chapter found space at Naval Station Everett and its Jim Creek area. This is the winter home for the PBRs. Inshore Boat Unit 11 at NS Everett has offered support. In fact, this support goes both ways. NW Chapter will co-operate with IBU 11 in training exercises, passing our experience to the next generation of Brown Water sailors.

### **Hurricane Katrina**

Hurricane Katrina impacted SBT 22 families by destroying about one third of their homes in the Bay St. Louis, MS area. I received this from MC Battles. Gamewardens had already decided to make a contribution to Katrina relief. I asked that we send that relief and other funds that we might raise directly to Special Warfare Command to assist SBT 22. We raised \$6,032.28. All of it went directly to SBT 22 family relief.

### **Donation Support in General**

It turns out that Gamewardens members are very generous all the time. Thank you. To recap, in addition to the Hurricane Katrina relief and PBR move of \$6,032.28 and \$2,475.00; we gave \$600.00 to Gamewardens General Fund and \$785.00 to Scholarship. We obtained a USPS ZIP plus four review of our database by Nancy Re from her company, Donnelley Marketing. This was a value of approximately \$900.00. **Thanks Nancy!** \$10,792.28 in one year shows member generosity and personal

### **GWVN Notice E-mail Program**

We finally have the beginnings of a one-on-one e-mail program that has the capability of sending e-mail to each member without having a list of other members in the TO: or CC: column. It gives us an ability to rapidly communicate with the full membership, granted we have a valid e-mail address. Currently, I have approximately 270 valid addresses installed. Charles Benninghoff, National Secretary, suggested the program.

Several things must be in place for it to be effective. First, we need a valid e-mail address that accepts attachments. Second, we need to be informed when e-mail addresses change. Third, security settings by individuals and their Internet Service Providers must be set to accept e-mail from [woody@texas.net](mailto:woody@texas.net) and [president@tf116.org](mailto:president@tf116.org). This will greatly assist in our electronic newsletter sending and will cut down on the cost of printed newsletters sent through the USPS.

Past review of this administrative issue determined that our generation is not all on line or computer literate, that some of us want a printed copy anyway and it is extremely hard to keep valid e-mail addresses available for those who do want electronic transmission of the newsletters. In the last newsletter, we asked for feedback on whether you wanted a mailed or electronic copy of the newsletter. Approximately 200 responded. By November, approximately 75 e-mail addresses had become invalid. Please keep us informed of your e-mail address.

### **Vietnam Combat Craftsman Crew Insignia**

Gamewardens is participating in an insignia project conceived and directed by Swift Boat Sailors Association (SBSA), Mobil Riverine Forces Association (MRFA) and Patrol Boat River – Foreign Veterans Association (PBR-FVA). This is a commemorative device, designed and copyrighted by the three organizations. Gamewardens is participating because we have members in PBR-FVA and we represent the full Gamewardens TF 116 heritage. Gamewardens will honor all the copyright and pricing arrangements that are part of this device. The device will be on sale in our Ships Store once it is received. The price will be \$7.00.

This project was conceived as a result of a failed letter writing campaign by individuals in these three organizations to get all the Vietnam era veterans "Grandfathered" either into the SWCC combat insignia or to have all crewmen be authorized to wear the Small Craft Combat Patrol Breast Insignia. That effort was turned down by the DoN. Navy reviewers did recommend that they could proceed to commercially produce a commemorative device that did not interfere with any active Navy devices, and all veterans meeting the group's qualifications could procure and wear it. The group submitted their design to the Navy for review. The Navy office (N75) made the final clearance of the device design after the Navy's Board of Decorations and Medals, Navy Uniform Board, and the Assistant for Legal and Legislative Matters for the Office of Chief of Naval Operations had cleared the design. N75 stated that the Navy had no objections and does not endorse the device design.

The device does not replace any Navy device awarded to any of our veterans

during the Vietnam Conflict. I am not sure, but I doubt that it can be worn on regulation Navy uniforms. It can be worn at our gatherings and events.

It shows the three TFs working together on projects such as the VUMM in San Diego. It represents TF 116 and the other groups. It is a very good design. Our participation is a statement that we are fully behind the other groups and are willing to work with them. I fully support it as a device for our members.

It also gave us an opportunity to test the GWVN E-Mail Notice program. Two Notices were sent, one detailing the device and a second correcting some of the information went to approximately 270 Gamewardens. Over two hundred feedback responses with 104 members committed to purchasing over 125 devices were received. Gamewardens generally approved the design. We have committed to the group for 500 devices at a cost of \$923.50 including shipping. There may be some shipping adjustment. 125 devices at \$7.00 each is \$875.00 covering the cost. Any additional sales will go directly to our Ships Store fund. Our National Ships Store is arranging with each Chapter to allow the chapter sell the devices and make some money as well.

### **Membership Administrative Issues**

An analysis of the Membership Database was undertaken this year. It was done to make sure that the membership data was as up to date as much as possible. I used the Excel Database I received in 2002. The reason for the analysis is that Gamewardens has existed over the years from the Yearly and Life dues, Reunion profits, Ships Store profits and donations made by members. No accounting method existed to collect the Yearly dues on the renewal date. Back in time, the renewal date was part of the mailing address for the quarterly newsletters

sent to each member. This worked, but not well. Members were left largely to make the renewal on their own, an honor system of renewal.

A chance to renew was made at each National Reunion by including a payment space for the Yearly renewal on the Reunion Registration. Renewals were usually made in this manner by those Yearly members who wanted to attend that particular Reunion. Some additional dues were collected in this manner. Yearly members who opted not to attend usually did not use this method of renewal. **RENEW NOW!**

Not having dues collection method by the National organization has placed some burden on finances, especially routine expenses such as the quarterly newsletter, which was costing approximately \$1,000.00 per mailing as reported at the 2002 Reunion. A plan to cut back the mailed newsletter by going electronically has not worked well so far. We have saved about three quarters of the approximately \$4,000.00 funds outlay we were expending. We have had other one time outlays that have continually stressed our current accounts including for example the crane services and trailer repair during the PBR move. We also, this year, donated Gamewardens funds to the Katrina relief.

With this in mind, I conducted this analysis of our Yearly dues finances. An entry by entry review was made to determine just how accurate the database is and to make changes from all available sources to ensure accuracy. I assumed it was not up to date. Many of the records did not have Date of Joining or Membership type entries. In cases where both were missing, no dues count was made. I did not have any membership application or finance records prior to 2002. I used the Join Date and Last Renewal Date entries for each member

review with October 2005 as the cutoff date for being paid up Yearly. As of October 18, 2005, there were 924 Class One Life and Yearly members. Additionally, there were 85 Status Unknown entries, which were not calculated in the total Out of Renewal Dues Years. Yearly Members were totaled at 269 with 214 Out of Renewal. Of the 214 Out of Renewal entries, the total Dues Years of unpaid membership dues was 1072. At \$30.00 per year, the non-collected dues were calculated at \$32,160.00 in lost revenue to Gamewardens.

In conclusion of this analysis, Gamewardens has missed out on good operating funds because we do not have a good renewal process in place. Our honor system of renewing does not work well. We are carrying several memberships that are, in all probably, not true active memberships. There are probably many reasons for this. I do not have the answers. A large number of the Out of Renewal memberships come directly from that time period on or before the 2000 Reunion. We may still have WC Chapter membership problems. Most likely, the majority of those memberships came for that one Reunion.

I do not want to lose any of them. We have lived without this revenue so far. We have a chance of changing it. This is a General Meeting Agenda Issue. It has been proposed by others that we change all Yearly Renewals to be due in August of the Reunion Year. We would offer the Yearly renewal at \$50.00 for two years. It would greatly save our cost of renewing letters as the Membership renewal would be part of the Reunion Registration as it is now.

This analysis will be available at the Reunion with backup documents. It has been submitted to the BoD.

**Membership Database**

Members helped in two areas this year on the database. One was the NCOA processing of the ZIP plus four by the USPS. As noted above, Nancy Re headed this effort through her company and helped us cover the majority of the ZIP plus four numbers in our mailing list. This has been a major cost to us in addition to mail-out in the past. Larry Weatherall headed the other effort in re-organizing the Excel records in a functional manner that will allow users to keep complete track of the membership.

**Member ID Cards**

The new member ID cards were completed this year. We have first time and replacement cards for yearly and life members.

**Medical Issues**

**VETERAN SERVICE OFFICES WILL HELP WITH YOUR CLAIM**

To determine entitlements and/or maximum benefits, veterans are advised to seek the assistance of a Veterans Service Office (VSO). The laws governing veterans' benefits are complicated and frequently change. The recent focus on improving benefits for veterans had led to new processes that can be confusing. The VSO at your nearest VA office, clinic, or within the

community is there to help you. The officers will provide help to you and your family/widow in filing claims for VA disability compensation, rehabilitation and education programs, social security disability benefits, etc. Services officers serve as advocates for you and your family/widow in any appeal needed on denied claims. They may prepare, present, and prosecute VA claims on your behalf, at no cost to you. If you have a health problem related to military service, you should file a claim for even if your condition is not necessarily serious today. Even if you're awarded only a 0% rating, it opens the door for future reevaluation, compensation, and health care if your condition deteriorates with age. VA claims are usually awarded back to the date of filing so it is important to file as soon as possible.

You can file a claim online at [www.vba.va.gov](http://www.vba.va.gov). That web site also offers information about claims for specific conditions for which you may be filing. Keep in mind that your **DD-214 discharge papers are key** to unlocking your veterans' benefits. Without it you are virtually locked out. Each state and most counties have VSOs who can help you with benefits, claims, and questions. A number of federally chartered veterans' service organizations also are approved by the secretary of Veteran Affairs to help. These include the Veteran of Foreign Wars, Disabled American Veterans, and the American Legion. Many cities also have Vet Centers where disability claims may be filed. To locate the nearest VSO you can check the directory of veteran service organizations at <http://www1.va.gov/vso>.

**VA PRESCRIPTION REFILLS** The Department of Veterans Affairs (VA) is now providing veterans prescription drug refills with more convenience, speed and security, thanks to a new service available over the Internet. The prescription refill service has quickly emerged as one of the more popular features in the "MyHealtheVet" system, which connects with VA's electronic records system. The request is routed to a computer system and filled by one of the VA's outpatient mail pharmacies. The refill is then sent directly to the veteran, eliminating a trip to the pharmacy.

Only 100,000 veterans have signed up to use "MyHealtheVet", which is located on VA's Web site at [www.myhealth.va.gov](http://www.myhealth.va.gov) – which maybe reflects the ongoing trend of distrust of the government, and how it uses information. But -If it's secure, and used correctly, these services will enhance veterans' health care in VA's future – we'll see.

**PROSTATE PROBLEMS** Many men will eventually be diagnosed with Prostate Cancer. Many others experience problems like benign prostate hyperplasia (BPH), also called enlarged prostate which affects a larger percentage of men than prostate cancer does. Those who have had prostate cancer treatment frequently experience incontinence and in some cases impotence. Aside from cancer there are other prostatic, urinary or bladder problems we are subject to as we age.

Become knowledgeable enough to recognize potential symptoms and, along with your physician, be prepared for early

diagnosis and treatment offering the best possibility of a cure. Do it now!

**JWW Note:** Prostate Cancer is one of the twelve cancers on the Agent Orange Registry. I can personally attest to becoming knowledgeable about the prostatic issues. My family doctor became concerned after a review of my PSA count from blood tests. In a four year period my PSA count went from near zero to over 6.02. As a result of the rapid rise in the PSA, two biopsies were done at Brooks Army Medical Center, one in July 2004 and a second in July 2005. The second showed cancer. In September, I went through Prostrate Cancer surgery to remove the prostate gland.

I recommend that all Gamewarden veterans begin tracking your health. The Veterans Administration literature states that in the general population, one in seven men will develop prostate cancer. In Vietnam veterans that ratio is one in three.
