The meeting kicked off with the pledge of allegiance and the following agenda items were covered.

1. Guest Speaker #1: NECC Chaplin, Capt. Debra McGuire.

Chaplin McGuire started with a prayer and then gave us a briefing on how her organization fits into the NECC Community. She has (5) Religious Ministries Teams (RMT's) within the overall NECC structure. Each RMT is a two person team consisting of a Commissioned Chaplin and a Senior Enlisted RT rate. "Lay Readers" within some of the groups augment the RMT's when they are not available. Each RMT is assigned to an individual section of NECC such as RIVRON, NCWS, EOD, etc. Some are currently deployed with their groups and others are home working with the "Warriors In Transition" program.

The Chaplin Corp is currently represented by Buddhist, Muslim, Hindu, Jewish, Catholic, Protestant and other faiths. They are responsible for accommodating the needs of all faiths, regardless of their own. The Navy



Chaplin School is merging with the Army School and will be collocated at Fort Jackson in Columbia, SC. There were some very interesting discussions regarding how things were back in the Vietnam era compared to how they are now and the 15 minutes that we had allocated for Chaplin McGuire stretched into at least 45.....

At the end of our discussion period, Coop presented Chaplin McGuire with a print of a WW II Shipboard Religious Service (see photo)

Personally, I can't thank Chaplin McGuire enough for coming out to talk with us. It was a great presentation and very well received by the group. She also took time from her schedule to visit the MK I at Little Creek on Friday and now has a much better understanding of the type of boats we used and the conditions we served under.
